
Thème: Segregation:

Segregation in the 1940's and 1960's in the United States was very difficult for black people because they were not equal to whites. Racial segregation was an organized separation, legally or in fact, between groups differentiated by the color of the skin (especially between black people and white people), with in the same country.

The separation can be physical with places forbidden to certain groups (restaurant, toilets, school, cinema, housing) or take the form of discrimination (hiring, renting, civil rights).

There were also racist groups like the "KKK" (Ku Klux Kan). Some states in the usa were more racist thanothers before the 1960's. Nowadays, the american society is fairer than before the 1960's.

Beetween the 1970 and 1960, some states in the South East of the USA were know fort their racist and segregation laws. They are called the « Jim Crow Laws », aka « separate but equal ».

Rosa Parks:

Rosa Parks is an Afro-American woman who became an iconic figure in the fight against racial segregation in the United States, earning her the name of "Mother of the Civil Rights Movement" from the American Congress who fought with Martin Luther King. She made a song against segregation "I sat on the bus" because his struggle began when a white man asked him to leave his place on the bus and she refused.

She was born on February 4 in Tuskegee Alabama (United States), who died on October 24, 2005 (at age 92) in Detroit Michigan (United States). Her birth name is Rosa Louise MC Cauley, she was a seamstress.
